College & Career Readiness

During College Kick-Off week each September, admissions representatives from various colleges and universities (approx. 35-40) speak with students interested in their schools about campus life, majors and minors, special programs, admissions requirements and more!

During our two **Instant Decision Days (November & January)**, we host 18-20 colleges at each event and interested students meet with admissions counselors to review application materials and receive admissions decisions “on the spot”.

On May 1st, we celebrate **National College Decision Day** each year! Seniors attend an admissions counselor panel and meet with the representatives from their respective schools.

Upon acceptance, beginning freshman year, students take a rigorous course load of **all honors courses**. Courses that are not traditionally “honors” courses require that the Academy Students complete an independent study research assignment with the guidance of the classroom teachers throughout the school year that culminates in a presentation to the class.

Beginning the summer after sophomore year, students will be able to take **courses at Felician University for college credit**. Students may take up to 6 credits per semester (36 total before graduating high school).
